OUR PRIORITIES

PRIORITY 1: CATHOLIC MINISTRY

Supporting Catholic primary principals with their ministry as leaders in Catholic education.

Helga Neidhart and Janeen Lamb outline in their paper, Australian Catholic Schools Today: School Identity and Leadership Formation (2016), that school principals play a vital leadership role in the evangelizing mission of the church. They quote the Vatican document, The Catholic School on the Threshold of the Third Millennium 1997, which situates Catholic education firmly within the context of socio-political and cultural change. Principals in Catholic schools appreciate that they can no longer assume school families or staff are connected to a parish and unquestioningly support church teaching. With this in mind, some actions we will take include:

- 1. Actively promote the importance of the faith and knowledge of CPPA members and future leaders (via CAPA and others) and support CEWA professional learning opportunities.
- 2. Review succession planning to ensure roles within the CPPA Executive and in national representation, are filled by CPPA members with a strong understanding of Catholic Identity.

PRIORITY 2: PRIMARY EQUITY & EXCELLENCE

Presenting the views of Catholic primary principals - ethically and with a keen eye on the future.

Respected education author Michael Fullan, suggests in his book *The Principal – Three Keys for Maximising Impact (2014)* that principals must "focus on building their own professional capacity and challenging the status quo - through questioning common practices, taking risks and avoiding letting the rules slow down action". With this in mind, some actions we will take include:

- 1. Ensure strong two-way communication occurs between all stakeholders.
- Continue to represent the views of Catholic Primary Principals on key issues, policies and developments being considered by CEWA & national organisations.
- 3. Ensure appropriate representation on committees and working parties.

PRIORITY 3: PRINCIPAL EXPERTISE & HEALTH

Supporting Catholic primary principals to be future focussed, effective and healthy leaders.

Research from the *Australian Principal Occupational Health, Safety and Well-being Survey (2018),* indicates that the health and wellbeing of many school principals is a concern. As an organisation with a focus on the future and serving members to enhance Catholic primary education, maintaining the expertise and well-being of our principals is critical. With this in mind, some actions we will take include:

- 1. Promote Principal well-being.
- 2. Actively contribute to the professional capacity of members.
- 3. Contribute to the professional capacity of the next generation of school principals.
- 4. Implement a consistent and data-informed review and development framework across primary schools.

PRIORITY 4: AN ASSOCIATION OF SUPPORT

Promoting dialogue, exchange of ideas and collegiality within CPPA, with other Principal organisations and within Catholic Education WA.

The Chief Executive of Reconciliation Australia, Karen Mundine, when interviewed in May 2019 suggested 'I think most Australians look at things in a very pragmatic way ... all Australians want to have a say in the things that matter to us, and doing that through a representative body sits in our egalitarian, democratic idea of who we are as Australians." With this in mind, some actions we will take include:

- 1. Strengthen collaboration and dialogue with Catholic Education WA, the Catholic Assistant Principals' Assoc (CAPA), Catholic Secondary Principals' Assoc (CSPA), other Principal associations and national peak bodies.
- 2. Explore contemporary and evidence-based models of leadership with CEWA, CSPA and CAPA.
- 3. Discuss and promote options for stewardship support of CPPA members.
- 4. Ongoing review of our programmed events to ensure they strengthen unity and collaboration.
